Lions Care Kits

Lion Janet reported that the club has distributed 875 Lions Care Kits from August to December 2020. In total the club has spent \$1440.00. The club was able to keep the cost down to \$1.65 per kit due to many generous donations by businesses and club members. As part of the program, **Lion Janet** also reported that we gave out winter accessories for 100 clients of the Anawim Food Bank.





"While distributing our Lions Personal Care Kits at the Anawim Place food bank, we observed that many of the food hamper recipients were lacking proper winter clothing. For the weeks leading up to Christmas, our club has set up a "Giving Tree" to donate necessary winter wear to those who need it.

Lions Service Ideas

Contact Lonely Seniors or Isolated People

• Can be done by phone or mail

Cards and Letters to Canadian Forces Overseas

• Write letters of encouragement and send them to soldiers.

Theatre & Sound System

- Setup after the pandemic
- Donation of recreational or entertainment equipment to Lions Kensington Court & Lions Villages.
- 85 inch wall-mounted TV at each location w/ sound system and theatre seats to create an in-house theatre for residents and visiting families
- Electronic games that require physical activity

Donate used books and puzzles to Lions Kensington Court & Lions Villages as well as other senior residences.

• Put a sticker on each "Donated by Edmonton Host Lions Club"

Plant flowers in bare public areas

- When restrictions have been lifted
- For spring (plan now)

Create welcome kits for new Canadians

- Put a sticker on each "Donated by Edmonton Host Lions Club"
- For distribution by Social agency or NGO
- A kit would contain items those new to Canada might need
 - Toques, mitts, personal hygiene kits

Donate Funds Books to Inner City Schools for Kids

- Funds could be used through the Scholastic books program
- Books are low priced, shipped directly to schools, aimed and written for children
- Scholastic offers a discount policy of up to 50%

Collect clean and nearly new stuffed animals and donate them to hospitals or homeless shelters Lions Donate non-perishable items to a local food bank

- Lions collect non-perishable items they have at home and place them in a box or bag
- The bags of items are collected from garages or front steps w/o contact and by being socially distant

Birthday Boxes

Create boxes with everything necessary for a birthday party to donate to a local homeless shelter.
 Include a cake mix that only requires the addition of water, candles, balloons, party hats, and other decorations.

Surplus Food Donations

Bring surplus food donations from local restaurants and grocers to a nearby food bank.





Vaccine Support

 Volunteer to help set up chairs, hand out cookies, organize appointments etc. for organizations doing COVID vaccine injections. (Lion Clint)

Lion Donna - Pro tip: wake up in the morning and get right into your workout gear! That way you've got a much higher chance of spending your entire day in workout gear.


Lion Jessica - Good morning. Time to immediately pick up my phone lest I be alone with my own thoughts for any amount of time.




Harry's Corner From the Archives
